




Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.


Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

ASHES DURING COVID

This year because of Covid, ashes will be distributed by sprinkling them on the heads of people as they come forward. Some people may not want to receive ashes in this manner. In such cases, people may attend Mass and receive Holy Communion without the imposition of ashes. The sprinkling of ashes is the more traditional form, though many people have never seen the practice.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

You are in the doctor's exam room, perched on the side of the examination table, awaiting the doctor's return. When he does so, the doctor brings another one with him. Their combined verdict is clear: "You have a strong case of cancer."

Since you've been a patient of this man for many years, you know of his special concern for you. You inherently know how much the doctor would rather be saying something else. That's how it could be for any one of us since the arrival of cancer and its varied forms. You dread the sudden imposition of isolation this may bring. Most family and friends take on this serious air around you. You are grateful for those who can still share a laugh with you, no matter the subject. And when you are alone, you try to remember that instead of holding a "pity party" for yourself.

All of that was part of the plight of the unnamed leper who met Jesus on that long ago day. He knew the pain of his condition, but the social strictures Leviticus demanded in those days that he live apart from family and friends and shout out to everybody "Unclean! Unclean!" Jesus will thus make all the difference.

Mark's description that Jesus was "moved with pity," is a bit tepid rendition of the original Greek word used here which is "embrimesamenos." The word means rather "strong emotions that boil over and find expression in groaning." That was the depth of the healing love in Our Lord's great heart that day. This weekend finds us in "the vestibule," so to speak, of Lent. We can easily acknowledge our need of repentance at any time, but Lent is a special season for this. Think of it as a retreat. At least as a time to zero in on the "leprosy" of sin that infects our souls regularly. How supportive, consoling, and hopeful it is to know that God sent us His son as an emissary who could be so concerned for our healing as to groan over us! I believe that prompted Jesus to say on another occasion "Come to Me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will refresh you."

Bishop Robert Barron offers this complementary pre-Lenten observation: "It is a biblical commonplace that we are unable to save ourselves from sin, since the very powers that we would muster to do so—the mind, the will, and the passions—are precisely what sin has compromised. Our only hope, therefore, is in the divine salvation offered as a gift."

In Lent, we're all, figuratively speaking, in "the office" of the Divine Physician, the Healer of souls. Tell him your condition, and then listen attentively. And don't be like this man who consulted with his doctor. "I have a terrible problem," he confided. "I've been carousing and misbehaving. It's been happening more and more frequently, and my conscience is beginning to trouble me very deeply. Can you give me something that will help?"

The doctor replied "Oh, I see, you want me to give you something to strengthen your willpower?" "No" the patient protested. "That's not it. I don't want to strengthen my willpower. I want you to give me something to weaken my conscience." Have a good Lent. *Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson*

FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE

With the hard work of Harvey Construction and their subcontractors, the support of Saint John XXIII Parish, and the effort of our amazing volunteers, Family Promise has made great strides the past couple of months. After watching construction progress for some time, we are ready for families to move in as of February 15th! Ten family suites are ready to greet new residents, and our industrial kitchen is ready to prepare meals. The pantry is full of donated food items, freezers, refrigerators, and food storage areas in place and available for stock. And to ensure security and 24-hour support to our families, we have recently hired two Resident Staff Assistants.

The additional floors are slated for completion by March 15th. Once fully renovated and cleaned, we will be able to house approximately 25 families. Never have we been able to support so many families in transition at one time. We will be able to continue our good work in providing long-term housing opportunities, where families do not have to move to a variety of locations to receive the support that they need. They can call Family Promise of Nashua home for the duration of their program.

We are incredibly grateful and find it hard to express our gratitude for all that has been afforded to us through this project. We are eager to dive in and start giving back. We are eager to see our families move in and thrive in the security of safe housing, hot meals, and the warm family atmosphere that we can now offer.
