




REFLECTION - 14TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Herbert Marshall McLuhan, who died in December 1980, coined the popular expression “the medium is the message” as well as the term global village, and predicted the World Wide Web almost 30 years before it was invented. He was a fixture in media discourse in the late 1960s, though his influence began to wane in the early 1970s. In the years following his death, he continued to be a controversial figure in academic circles. However, with the arrival of the Internet and the World Wide Web, interest was renewed in his work and perspective.

I believe that expression “the medium is the message” is applicable to many realms beyond the obvious one. For example, a run-down neighborhood emits a clear message about the ineffectiveness of city government as well as the financial and/or spiritual state of the residents. On the other hand, a well maintained civic building, clean and well-landscaped, sends another more positive message.

When it comes to the subject of today’s Readings, the spread of God’s good news, McLuhan’s theory is proven. In the case of Christianity, the Jesus who is the very Center of the message, and therefore the “medium” of it, if you will, is perfect. The New Testament bears impeccable witness of this.

When it comes to the 72 disciples, Jesus’ chosen messengers, they themselves became the “medium” the wide world would see and hear. You can imagine the effectiveness of their excitement after seeing Christ’s resurrection. When you combine that with the Apostles’ personal experience of Him for 3 years, up to and including the crucifixion, and you certainly have an attractive host of “mediums” for the great message the whole wide world needed to hear, then and now.

In today’s gospel we “overhear” Christ’s instructions to the disciples as they go forth as “laborers for the harvest.” They were to travel in pairs, so that their witness was doubly credible. They were not to be encumbered by excess baggage. They were to offer peace to people, a precious gift sorely needed then and always. They were to be ready for audience resistance as well.

For us, who know that the grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, there is the comfort of knowing that the message is truly “Good News.” The only flawed element may be ourselves as the “medium.” Indeed, we can hinder its delivery and acceptance. Any forfeit we make of our given Faith, brought about by our sin, is the killer drawback. That’s when we must remember that “A Christian is someone who makes it easier for other people to believe in God.”
