REFLECTION - 19TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

In long bygone days, Catholic grade school report cards came in two colors. There was no hint of gender confusion. Boys got tan; girls got white. The left side of both versions told readers, primarily Mom and Dad, the teacher's subjective evaluation of their child based on quarterly observation. The right side was all about test results that yielded cold hard numbers (probably with a hidden subjectivity somewhere).

That left side was "the land of the A's, B's and C's." The desired outcome, naturally, was to receive "all A's." I'm happy to report that I gained "the crown" now and then, but not always. My stumbling block was the category called "Self-control." Translation: "talking while Sister was teaching." However the first three words in the helpful (for our parents) description were: "Restrains hasty impulses." The fact that I remember the phrase all these years later shows you how aware I am of this personal flaw, true or not. So I aim for due diligence every time I have to make a serious decision. That could be an Amazon purchase all the way to my cemetery plot and everything in between. To my place in a diocesan cemetery and anything in between. I feel a special kinship with the great but generally impulsive St. Peter. When Peter was afraid on that "dark and stormy night" on the sea, he could hardly believe it was his beloved Master who was calmly standing a short distance from the wave tossed boat (read here "the Church"). So what does he do, but impulsively jump into the roiling waters until his unscientific observation kicked in and started him thinking and sinking.

Although none of the evangelists ever told us that Jesus smiled, much less laughed, I can't help thinking that Jesus' handsome face smiled and then He gave out a hearty laugh as he stretched out those mighty arms of His to give a sputtering Peter a lift up and said "O ye of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Dear Church of Christ I ask you, in this confusing time, in summer of 2023, the same question Peter was asked. Do you even doubt? Do I? Beware that hasty impulse to say "No way, Lord." Because most likely you have. That's when you get that sinking feeling. The Mass becomes routine; the Holy Eucharist a hollow repetition. Your smile rare. Worst of all, it just might ruin your otherwise good report card that a merciful but justly objective Jesus will read on your Judgment Day.

MISSION APPEAL AUGUST THIS WEEKEND

This weekend, August 12 & 13, 2023, Very Rev. Pradeep Puthenveetil, O.SS.T. (Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives) will be in our parish for a mission appeal. Fr. Pradeep is the Vice-Provincial of St. Michael of the Saints Vice-Province India. He is currently stationed in their Vice Provincial Office, Bangalore, India. At each Mass Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. In this part of the county children do not have access to a proper education due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha Elementary School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. The Trinitarians are hopeful that your generosity during this Mission Appeal will help them to more effectively live their school's motto, "Educate to Liberate."
