REFLECTION 31ST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

You need a license these days for so many things. That includes one for driving a car, truck, or bus. For hunting game, fishing for fish, or carrying a pistol, and for so many more of life's activities. Attached along with the license are bunches of regulations and penalties for ignoring them. But one doesn't need a license for practicing hypocrisy.

As truth itself, Our Lord was rightly repulsed by any instance of this, especially when He found it among religious leaders of His people. Today He offers a withering critique of the scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy.

On another occasion, He had called them "blind guides." Today He urges the people in His audience to observe what they teach, but not how they acted. Why? Because "they preach but they do not practice."

I am at once sorry and ashamed upon pondering those words at the behavior of some of my brother priests who deserve that same rebuke. They brought great harm to many people, especially among the young, by their abuse of them. It remains an ongoing scandal. The late Benedict XVI succinctly described it as "filth" within the Church. It remains one of the devil's most successful efforts to harm the Church. But today we hear Our Lord speak so powerfully about hypocrisy that could dwell in you and me. His assessment requires introspection on our parts. Have we, in some way or other, "preached" but not practiced? Have we given the young and not-so-young among us the kind of bad example that threatens their respect and love for the teachings of Christ and His Church? I think we do when we neglect our participation at the Mass, or we speak negatively about the pope or our pastor, who are our spiritual leaders. Our choice of TV shows. Our often-crude language. All habits that invite the young to imitate.

Our Lord offers a remedy; be humble. Recognize that true fidelity to God is shown by service of Him, followed by service to other people. Above all, to practice what you "preach" by your lifestyle.

A father once complained about the amount of time his family spent watching television. His children watched cartoons and neglected schoolwork. His wife preferred soap operas to housework. His solution?
